Bring an end to the stigma, helping everyone to know the depth of their belovedness, no matter their HIV status. We pray especially for the work of AID Upstate. As we watch and we wait, O God,

receive our prayer.

God of new possibilities, when addiction wounds, jealousy tears down, and relationships fray, show us how to journey with one another. Nurture therapists, counselors, and sponsors in their care for others. As we watch and we wait, O God,

receive our prayer.

God of all time, build up our lives that we would reflect your grace. At the last, bring us with all the saints to your holy city where peace and goodness make a home. As we watch and we wait, O God,
receive our prayer.
