Children's Worship Activity. Accompanied by Child Protection trained adults, children are invited to leave worship after the children's sermon to go hear the scripture read in ways more appropriate for their age. Using lectionary stories heard in worship each Sunday, the children not only hear scripture, but enjoy a related activity such as a game, craft, or music. Children return to worship during the sharing of the peace and in time to participate in the celebration of Holy Communion.

Communion. In an effort to further embrace Trinity's mission of welcome, affirmation, and hospitality, both wine and grape juice are available in the split chalice.

Worship Bags are available in the Narthex or the Gym for children. Bags for preschoolers are tied with a white ribbon. Bags for elementary age children have no ribbon. After worship, used bags may be placed in the baskets next to the stands.

Nursery for infants and toddlers. A nursery hosted by a member of the Trinity staff, Beth Oswald, as well as a small group of rotating volunteers who have been trained in Trinity's Child Protection Policy is available each Sunday morning beginning at 9:45 am to care for infants and toddlers who would prefer enjoying play time instead of attending 10:00 am worship. The nursery is located on the first floor of the Pence Building. Please reach out to a greeter or usher if you need assistance.

Trinity's Adult Faith Exploration class concluded its study on the book of Romans this morning. The class will then welcome Jerry Wesley, LMFT-A as a discussion leader on Sunday, November 16 and Sunday, November 23. Jerry recently joined the Trinity staff as Coordinator for Mental Health Wellness. He is passionate about serving marginalized communities and brings expertise in addiction and family counseling. Jerry will lead discussion for these two consecutive weeks as an introduction to the services he brings to the Trinity family. Specific topics will be announced each week. As always, class begins at 9:00 am in Rooms 12 & 13 as well as via Zoom.

Adult Faith Exploration Advent Series. For the four Sundays of Advent, the Adult Faith Exploration Class will explore and experience how Christmas is observed in each of the four Gospels in a study led by Renee Heiliger. This creative, four-session adult study compares each of the Gospels to styles of various homes. Illustrations of each Gospel house are provided by artist Kevin Burns based on his interpretation of the shape and character of each Gospel. Together adults will be invited to view Christmas from the different perspectives offered in each house as they further reflect on the mystery of Jesus. This study is interactive, hands on, and engages the heart as followers journey to the manger. Class begins at 9:00 am in Rooms 12 & 13 November 30, December 7, 14, and 21.

When Relationships Turn Toxic. Trinity is hosting a group for female-identifying persons who are struggling with toxic relationships in their lives and navigating the challenges that come with these relationships. It will be a judgment free time to find community with others struggling with similar issues. Jerry Wesley, Trinity's Coordinator for Mental Health Wellness, will be hosting the group for the first time today at 11:30 am on the first floor of the Education Building. Childcare is provided. A simple lunch will be served at 11:30 am for participants and their children.

Men's Reflection and Fellowship Group. A Reflection and Fellowship Group for men meets on the second Wednesday of the month from 7:00–8:00 am in the Parlor. Calvin Harmon leads and facilitates this group with the intent of providing a brave, safe space for mutual sharing and encouragement. The morning includes a light breakfast as well as time for devotions and prayer. Upcoming meeting dates include November 12 and December 10.
