On May 26, 2025 I marked thirty years of ordained ministry. In those early years, so many nay-sayers said I would not make it past five years, seven at the absolute most. But here I am...by the grace of God...still standing...still doing the work and ministry God has called me to do. In more recent years, I am doing the very thing God created me to do which is to create spaces of love, welcome, radical hospitality, and belonging for many and diverse people, to preach the gospel with clarity and authenticity with an eye always toward the oppressed and marginalized, and to lean into new ways of doing ministry that likely don't resemble ministry in those early years. Yes, I am looking back to the hard times of conflict and persecution, to the loss of dear friends who entered the Church Triumphant during my time shepherding this congregation, and to the times of triumph, bold decisions, and new paths forward. I am looking back at the relationships built and nurtured...many that still stand strong, others that have withered, but that still bless my life and ministry in the way I remember them. I am looking back and remembering and cherishing and celebrating the way God's Spirit is at work in me, saint and sinner, beloved child of God, and one who does not always get it right. I am giving thanks for all I have learned, all the ways I have grown as a pastor and a leader. (A list of learnings is included later in this newsletter.) I invite you to look back...to the last month, to all of 2025, to the past decade. What matters? What does not? How shall you emerge stronger, more faithful, more authentic to who and whose you are in this new year? God is at work in you, in me, in our life together, and in the joyful transformation that is happening among us.

## COUNCIL NOTES

At the December meeting of the Congregation Council, the council...

- welcomed Lynn Andrews, Chris Barsody, William Bryant, Clayton Dykes, Carl Witherspoon, and Matthew Wessinger as newly elected members of Congregation Council;
- regretfully accepted Angie Hager's resignation from council as she and her family anticipate a move to Charlotte to access needed care for little Javi;
- appointed Jess Bigby to fill the two years remaining on the vacated council position;
- noted that expenses for November were \$738 more than projected;
- approved an increase in the line of credit;
- received a report from the Executive Committee noting that negotiations for the sale of the 429 Property continue, the church bus was conveyed for a sale price of \$2,500, and a proposal for new, more efficient lighting fixtures throughout the campus is moving forward;
- learned about the next steps in the call process outlined by Bishop Aebischer and of her support and guidance as this process continues;
- approved documents outlining a position entitled "Pastor of Queer Ministry and Belonging" and appointed an Interview Team (Amanda Cook, convener and chair, Matt Cobb, Jaime Fivecoat, Harper Roth, Philip Wessinger, and Pastor Crowell, advisory member with voice, no vote) who will interview Patrick Preacher for this position and make a recommendation to the council at the January meeting;
- designated housing allowances for both Pastor Parham and Pastor Crowell;
- authorized the Executive Committee and staff to appoint 2026 committees;
- elected Richard Moose to serve as Vice-President, Mike Boliek to serve as the Treasurer, and Margaret Roth to serve as the Secretary for 2026;
- agreed that all council members and officers of the congregation will be installed at worship on Sunday, January 11, 2026;
- agreed that the next scheduled meeting of Congregation Council will take place on Sunday, January 25 at 1:30 pm and will include an orientation; and
- expressed gratitude to outgoing council members for their faithful leadership and service to Angie Hager, Dean Hybl, Kerry Sease, Chris Sorenson, Chris Wannemacher, Lani Wise, and Lexi Thomas-Harewood.

## MUSIC MINISTRY

As a new calendar year begins, hearty thanks to all who offered time and musical gifts to enriching and strengthening worship in 2025. If interested in singing and/or ringing in 2026, now is the perfect time to join. Work on new choral and handbell music for Epiphany, Lent, and Easter is beginning.



The Adult Choir will begin rehearsals on January 7, 2026. Rehearsals are Wednesdays from 7:00 to 8:15 pm in the Choir Room on the second floor of the Pence Building. On Sunday mornings, the choir gathers for warmups in the Choir Room from 9:30 to 9:50 am. For 10:00 am worship, the choir assembles in the Sanctuary balcony or around the piano in the Gym to support and strengthen congregational singing and to offer special choral music in a wide variety of styles that proclaims, enriches, and interprets the scripture for the day.

Martin Luther called music the “Servant of the Gospel,” so the goal is to offer music that draws minds, bodies, emotions, and imaginations to experience more deeply God’s rich, inspiring, and often challenging word. Everyone with a love of singing is invited to join this community of musical mission partners. There are no auditions, but new singers are invited to schedule an orientation meeting with Pastor Parham prior to their first rehearsal. At that meeting, the new choir member will be paired with a numbered folder for choir music, a hymnal, a robe for when the choir leads singing in the Sanctuary, and will take a brief tour of the building. **Continued from Cover Letter...Things I've learned in 30 years of ministry...especially in the past 7 years as shepherd to a radically-transforming, progressive community of faith focused on grace, inclusion, diversity, and love...**

- Love wholly and completely the one who shows up for worship -- not knowing whether this will be their only visit or the beginning of a long relationship.
- Receive new members to the community with love and grace and ease. Release the ones who choose to find a spiritual home in a new place with the same love, grace, and ease.
- So often the best thing one can do is stop, rest, be still, and connect to the endless supply of love, faith, and energy that only God can provide.
- Most of the challenges in life together in a progressive Christian community stem from fear - fear of change, fear of not having enough, fear of losing power, influence, or position.
- Some times things are personal; Most of the time they are not.
- There are many facets to the truth - versions people tell themselves, versions they tell one another, versions they tell me. The full and complete truth is rarely known.
- Always, always lean into the future. Resist the urge to lean into the past. Learn from the past, but keep moving forward.
- Progressive Christian communities are constantly transforming.
- Be your true authentic self. Practice vulnerability.
- The best decisions are made in groups.
- Sometimes you get credit for the good things. You are always blamed for the bad things. There are rarely exceptions to this.
- Set and keep healthy boundaries. Saying no is good and faithful ministry.
- Everybody is doing the best they can. Give everybody the benefit of the doubt. Extend grace upon grace.
- Do not take yourself too seriously. Lighten up! This work is fun and life-giving!
- Communal belonging is the hallmark of progressive Christian communities. Every single person that becomes part of the Trinity beloved community changes the community. This is one of the biggest differences between progressive, inclusive congregations and others.
- Always make time for the bucket fillers - the ones who give energy. Limit time with the bucket dippers - the ones who can suck the life out of you.
- Never ever spend time alone with parishioners who intend to harm and hurt you. Ministry requires protecting your own heart.
- Stay faithful to the mission...always...even, and especially, when it is hard.
- God's grace is always sufficient.
- God always makes a way. Even in the darkest nights God is clearing a way forward.
- Be strong, and loving, and fearless.

The research teams for Greenville Organized for Accountable Leadership have held the following meetings:

Mental Health Research had a meeting on Tuesday, December 9 with Tiffany Parker, the Executive Director of NAMI. Affordable Housing met with State Representative

Paul Wickensimer regarding eviction bill H-4270 and his ideas regarding an eviction court pilot. On Tuesday, December 16 a group met with Tina Belge, Greenville City Council member, to discuss GHF's goal of producing 10,000 new units between 2020 and 2030. On December 17 a zoom meeting was held with Piedmont Health Foundation to hear ideas for an eviction court pilot program. January 21 is advocacy day at the State Capital. Several members will be there to advocate for House Bill H-4270 in person.
