Dear Beloved Trinity Community,

Leaning into Love this Lent is opening my heart and mind in ways I had not imagined. Does my life and my ministry point to love? Do I allow love to be my daily guide?

I am learning that love means being as concerned with the discomfort of others as much as I am concerned with my own discomfort. Does walking the path of love mean that I love others with the same voracity, the same fierceness, the same tenderness, the same mother-bear instincts with which I love my very own child? How can it be? How is this possible? And yet, this seems to capture the fullness, the depth of love's call.

What if the struggles, indignities, and suffering of children at the border affected me as if these children were my children? What if the challenges of the trans community became my own challenges? What if I stood in true solidarity with those living in poverty, the unhoused in our community, and immigrants trying to build a new life? What if the plight of our siblings of color became my plight? And what of the dear ones who speak ill of me? Can I extend care and kindness to them? The same care and kindness I would like extended to me? As I bear witness to my own brokenness, can I see the brokenness in others and respond, not with impatience and annoyance, but with extra measures of compassion and grace?

Being a part of the Beloved Community means that we are always striving for love, always working to extend love in radical ways to those who are hurting, forgotten, lonely, isolated, poor, hungry, or struggling. This has become my Lenten prayer practice, my Lenten pondering, my put-love-into-action spiritual discipline. How can we best walk the path of love? Our best hope in finding a way to love is to find a way together. As Lent continues, may we strive together to walk the path of love.

COUNCIL AND BUSINESS

Council Notes

At the February meeting of the Congregation Council, the council...

- received a Treasurer's Report noting that during the last three days of 2025, \$79,400 was received, resulting in the 2025 budget being 99% funded with a deficit of \$11,289 which is reflected in a small decrease in the Net Working Fund;
- learned that a change in software required to revision the weekly bulletins and monthly newsletter has resulted in the need for outsourcing Trinity's publications. The cost of this outsourcing is offset by a decrease in staffing hours by Karen Craig,
- received an enthusiastic recommendation from the Interview Team (serving as a Call Committee as outlined by Bishop Ginny Aebischer) composed of Amanda Cook (Chair and Convener), Matt Cobb, Jaime Fivecoat, Harper Roth, Philip Wessinger, and Pastor Crowell (advisory member, no vote) to the council to extend a call to Patrick Preacher to serve as Trinity's Pastor for Queer Ministry and Belonging. Council completed an interview process with Patrick and exuberantly and unanimously approved the Executive Committee's motion to call a meeting of the congregation on Sunday, March 1 at 11:30 am (following worship) in the Gym for the sole purpose of acting on this motion to call Patrick Preacher to serve as Trinity's Pastor of Queer Ministry and Belonging;
- heard an extensive report on the 429 Property to include a history and review of the property listing, interest in property, as well as setbacks and challenges. Conversations with potential buyer are continuing; and
- learned that Trinity's Strategic Plan (began in March, 2025 with the installation of the Strategic Planning Team) is nearing completion with some finishing details to ensure that the plan is specific and unique to Trinity's mission and ministry.

Leaning into Love in Lent

A Forty-Day Lenten Journey

This year, instead of adding extra mid-week worship services and activities that can become both burdensome and exhausting, Trinity invites you into a quieter, more gentle, more home-based experience guided by the theme "Leaning into Love in Lent." This theme does not encourage participants to ask, "What should I give up?" but rather "How can I love and care for myself in ways that will help me better love and care for the world?"

- Where am I being invited to soften rather than harden?
- How can I practice love for my body, heart, mind, and spirit?
- How can I show up more fully for my neighbors, especially the neighbors who are struggling, the ones who are constantly overlooked, misjudged, oppressed, and marginalized?
- In what ways can each of us work, during this Lenten season, to make Greenville a more fair, equitable, and just community for all people?
- How can we better practice love and compassion for ourselves and for others?
- How can we grow into grace?

A Lenten Calendar that includes daily ideas and activities for leaning into love is provided in this publication. Each person may choose to participate in all daily suggestions, complete a few of the suggestions, or create other ways that seem more appropriate to lean into love this Lent. The calendar is not intended to be prescriptive or burdensome. It simply contains ideas for this Lenten Season that will further connect the Trinity beloved community with each other and with the world.

On several Sundays in Lent, after worship and during refreshments and fellowship, a simple Lenten activity designed to lean into love by encouraging and lifting up others will be included. All are invited and encouraged to participate in ways that best fit individual schedules and that are most meaningful.

Martin Luther called music the "Servant of the Gospel," so our mission is to offer music that invites our minds, bodies, emotions, and imaginations to experience more fully God's rich, inspiring, and often challenging word. Everyone with a love of singing is invited to join this community of musical mission partners. There are no auditions, but new singers are invited to schedule an orientation meeting with Pastor Parham prior to their first rehearsal. At that meeting new participants will be assigned a numbered folder for choir music, a hymnal, a robe for when worship is in the Sanctuary, and take a brief tour of rehearsal spaces, the Sanctuary balcony, and the Gym.
