Dear Beloved Trinity Community,

My heart is so full of joy at this community's enthusiastic decision to extend a call to our dear Patrick to serve as Trinity's Pastor for Queer Ministry and Belonging. It greatly pleases me that his title includes the word "belonging."

We live in a world where people feel isolated, cut off, excluded, alone. Each of us possesses a desperate hunger to belong, to find our people, discover our tribe, and become a part of a community of love and welcome. We are desperate to find the partner, the work, the home, the place where we can be our full, authentic selves, where there is no need to hide our queerness, our quirkiness, our poverty of spirit, our fears, our longings, or our deepest desires.

The word *belonging* is a combination of the words being and longing. Each of us possesses a deep longing to be fully ourselves in a community with others who truly see us. Some of us find this belonging in our families, with special friends, on a team, or at church. That's the desire for Trinity – to be a place of belonging, especially for those of us who often feel like outsiders, that have often been pushed to the side.

One of the places I am finding belonging is in a ministry experiment that began in January. The most recent group of Trinity new members have formed a community group...meeting monthly to share a meal and nurture relationships. It's a special group of people with whom I feel comfortable, at ease, without the need to perform or please, a place to let down my guard, to be fully and completely me without any fear of judgment or rejection, to be my authentic, transparent self and know that I am loved, honored...that I belong.

The Easter promise of a new creation gives me hope and courage. God is always doing a new thing among us. Things never stay the same. Our beloved Trinity is in a constant state of transformation. And this transformation is leading to belonging...belonging for more and more of God's beloveds. May God give you courage and hope in this Easter season to find and create places of joyful belonging.

COUNCIL AND BUSINESS

Council Notes

At the March meeting of the Congregation Council, the council...

- noted with excitement that Patrick Preacher has accepted the call to serve as Pastor of Queer Ministry and Belonging at Trinity and that he will be ordained by Bishop Ginny Aebischer on Sunday, May 24 at 10:00 am during worship in the Sanctuary;
- received a Treasurer’s Report noting that expenses for February were \$583 more than projected;
- received a report from Richard Moose regarding the 429 Property and the additional extension of the contract and continued negotiations with potential buyer;
- received a report from Mike Boliek noting that the energy savings lighting project is underway, with the exception of the Gym, due to complications with the compatibility of the fixtures; and
- learned from Pastor Parham that the organ installation is scheduled for April 13, 2026.
