May is Mental Health Awareness Month, and I am pondering all the ways our physical, mental, and spiritual health are bound together. It is a joy for our beloved community to be living out this reality with the presence of Jerry Wesley, LMFTA, on our staff serving as Coordinator of Mental Health Wellness. For so long, we have been hesitant to discuss our mental health, but I sense a new openness to having these conversations. This is a sign of a transformed community!

Our faith does not call us to perfection. Our faith calls us to holiness. And holiness includes every part of us: mind, body, and spirit. The sacred stories we inherit are filled with people who knew despair and doubt as much as they knew hope and joy. We follow a path that honors truth telling, compassion, and presence – not denial or silence. What does it look like for us to care for our mental and emotional well-being as well as our spiritual and physical health?

- It could look like honoring rest as holy not as weakness.
- It could look like checking in on a friend and really listening.
- It could look like setting boundaries that protect our energy and strength.
- It could look like reaching out for help when the weight is too heavy to carry alone.

It definitely looks like creating a community of faith where every person knows they belong, not just in their strength, but in their vulnerability. A place where we can bring our whole selves without fear or judgment. A place where healing is not rushed but gently nurtured.

As we move through this month my hope and prayer is that we can practice compassion, especially toward ourselves, and that we can release the myth that we must always be strong and in control. You are never alone. May we learn to care for each other in ways that bring healing, wholeness, and life.

COUNCIL AND BUSINESS

Council Notes

At the April meeting of the Congregation Council, the council...

- received a Treasurer’s Report noting that expenses for March were \$640 more than projected;
- received an update from Richard Moose regarding the 429 property and the ongoing negotiations with potential buyer, to include the added requirement from the city to make significant improvements to the lower parking lot;
- received a draft of the organizational structure for 2026 to include committee/team members on the Sustaining Ministry Team, Worship Team, Faith Exploration Team, Facility Care Team, Welcome and Hospitality Team, and Mercy and Justice Team; and
- learned that Austin Blythe, Jaime Fivecoat, Karen Fivecoat, Carl Witherspoon, Pastor Parham, Patrick Preacher, and Pastor Crowell will serve as voting members to the SC Synod Assembly in June.

South Carolina Synod Assembly

Lutherans across the state will gather under the theme Created to Create in Columbia, SC on June 11 – 13 for the Synod’s annual gathering. The assembly will include plenary sessions, worship, an opportunity to honor Bishop Aebischer’s ministry, and the election of a new bishop. Voting members from Trinity include Austin Blythe, Jaime Fivecoat, Karen Fivecoat, Carl Witherspoon, Pastor Parham, Patrick Preacher, and Pastor Crowell. Please pray for this gathering and the Spirit’s guidance that decisions will be made to help the SC Synod become a welcoming and affirming synod.

INTRODUCING A PRAY AND PLAY AREA IN WORSHIP

Soon, worshippers in the Gym worship space will begin seeing a Pray and Play area being put together, piece by piece. A Pray and Play Area is a designated space within the worship area where young children are welcome to be present and engaged during worship in ways that suit how they naturally learn and experience the world: through movement, touch, and imaginative play. This area will include a large rug, books, simple figures, soft play items, and even Communion sets for children to enact the Lord’s Supper along with the Presider. Other items will be included that connect children to the sights and sounds of worship happening around them. Rather than asking children to be still and silent a Pray and Play Area says with its very presence: you belong here! It reflects Trinity’s deep theological conviction that children are not simply future members of the congregation, but full participants in the Body of Christ right now. Just as Jesus welcomed children into his midst and declared that the Kin-dom of God belongs to such as these (Mark 10:14), this area will make that welcome visible and concrete. It honors the reality that children engage and pray differently than adults — and that this difference is a gift to the whole worshipping community, not a disruption to be managed.

GOAL Nehemiah Action Update

Over 1,000 community members (at least 30 from Trinity) gathered on Thursday, April 9 at First Baptist, Greenville to speak truth to power. A commitment was received from a Greenville county school board member and several city council members to work toward adding fifty-one mental health counselors to the staff of Greenville County Schools and to strengthen zero tolerance bullying policies by the 2027-2028 school year. State legislators in attendance at the Action voiced continued support of Bills H4270 and S983, both of which would seal or remove evictions from a tenant's record. These victories are being celebrated! However, no county council members came to support the urgent need for a Housing Court, a proven solution to reduce evictions. There is still much work to be done.
