Dear Beloved Trinity Community,

I am eager and hopeful for summer, for the opportunity to slow down, to rest, to enjoy some time away with family and friends, and to read more, to pay more attention, to settle my heart, mind, and body, and to reset my energy and passion. I'm not good at rest. It can be hard for me. I enjoy being on the move, getting things done, connecting with others, but I am learning through yoga, meditation, and prayer to be still, to be silent, to settle my mind by settling my body.

June invites us into a different rhythm. The days stretch longer, schedules loosen, and many of us find ourselves stepping out of the usual pace of work and obligation. In a culture that often equates busyness with worth, this shift can be challenging. But, what if this slowing down is not a disruption of our lives, but rather an opportunity to more fully inhabit our lives?

Summer offers us a sacred pause – a reminder that rest is not something we have to earn, but something God already weaves into the fabric of creation. From the very beginning, rest is part of the holy pattern. Jesus himself stepped away from the crowds, inviting his disciples to do the same. The psalmist encourages us to be still, to silent all the noise in our minds. This is not an invitation to withdraw from the world's needs, but rather an invitation to be renewed in our ability and desire to meet those needs.

In stepping away from constant demands, we create space to be restored, to more fully inhabit our humanity. Rest reminds us that we are human beings, not human doings. How might God be calling you into a period of sacred rest? My hope and prayer is that you will open yourself to the joy of slowing down, to the joy of sacred rest.

# COUNCIL AND BUSINESS

## Council Notes

At the May meeting of the Congregation Council, the council...

- unanimously approved a plan for mission and ministry as presented by Mark Tidsworth, founder and Team Leader of Pinnacle Leadership Associates, and members of the Coordination Team. The strategic plan will be shared and explored at a congregational lunch and gathering following worship on Sunday, June 7;
- joyfully approved thirteen new members into the life of the Trinity community;
- enthusiastically affirmed a proposal for collaborative ministry with The Nest, an inclusive, welcoming, affirming learning space that seeks to fill the educational gaps in children’s lives, by providing space on the Trinity campus. Responsibility for management and final approval was designated to the Executive Committee;
- received an update from Richard Moose on the 429 property noting that a congregational meeting will likely be needed in the coming months as negotiations continue;
- designated a portion of Patrick’s Preacher salary beginning on July 1, 2026 as housing allowance;
- learned from William Bryant, Jr., chair of the Sustaining Ministry Team, that the team will host a Las Vegas Games Night on Friday, September 18 to begin the fall stewardship campaign; and
- agreed that the next regularly scheduled meeting of council would take place on Sunday, August 16 at 1:30 pm.

## South Carolina Synod Assembly

Lutherans across the state will gather under the theme Created to Create in Columbia, SC on June 11 – 13 for the Synod’s annual gathering. The assembly will include plenary sessions, worship, an opportunity to honor Bishop Aebischer’s ministry, and the election of a new bishop. Voting members from Trinity include Austin Blythe, Jaime Fivecoat, Karen Fivecoat, Carl Witherspoon, Pastor Parham, Pastor Preacher, and Pastor Crowell. Please pray for this gathering and the Spirit’s guidance that decisions will be made to help the SC Synod become a welcoming and affirming synod.

## CHILDREN, YOUTH, AND FAMILIES

### Trinity Youth

Every three years, thousands of high schoolers and their adult leaders from across the ELCA come together for the ELCA Youth Gathering. It's not just an event but a movement in which faith ignites, and community comes alive. Through inspiring speakers, experiential learning, and transformative connections, young people experience the church in bold, unforgettable ways. Each night, participants share a unique faith experience through high-energy worship and powerful storytelling. The Gathering is an opportunity to ask big questions, grow in faith, and be part of something bigger than ourselves.

This powerful event is scheduled for **June 28 – July 2, 2027** in Minneapolis, MN. Youth must be in 8 – 12 grade at the time of registration (fall 2026).

Parents and youth are invited to attend an information meeting on Sunday, June 28, to discover more about this exciting opportunity. The meeting will be held in the Youth Room, following worship. Lunch will be provided.

### Introducing A Pray and Play Area in Worship

Trinity's Gym worship space now features a Pray and Play Area! This is a designated space within the worship area where young children are welcome to be present and engaged during worship in ways that suit how they naturally learn and experience the world: through movement, touch, and imaginative play. The area currently includes a large rug, books, stuffed animals, soft play items, and other items to allow children to engage in worship — and it will continue to grow and evolve over time. Additional items will be added to help connect children to the sights and sounds of the worship happening around them. Rather than asking children to be still and silent, the Pray and Play Area says with its very presence: you belong here! It reflects Trinity's deep theological conviction that children are not simply future members of the congregation, but full participants in the Body of Christ right now. Just as Jesus welcomed children into his midst and declared that the Kin-dom of God belongs to such as these (Mark 10:14), this area makes that welcome visible and concrete. It honors the reality that children engage and pray differently than adults — and that this difference is a gift to the whole worshiping community, not a disruption to be managed. ### Nursery for Sunday Worship

A nursery hosted by a member of the Trinity staff, Beth Oswald, as well as a small group of rotating adult volunteers who have been trained in Trinity's Child Protection Policy is available each Sunday morning beginning at 9:45 am to care for infants and toddlers who would prefer enjoying play time instead of attending 10:00 am worship. The nursery is located on the first floor of the Pence Building. Please reach out to a greeter or usher if assistance is needed.

### Children's Worship Opportunity

Children's Worship Opportunity is central to the mission of introducing Trinity's young children to the stories of faith. New adult volunteers are always needed. Leaders must be Child Protection Policy approved (completed through the Church Office). Lesson plans are prepared in advance for those leading. This means leaders simply get to have fun with a group of boisterous and fun children who are excited and curious about faith.
