Honoring Sabbath: A Communal Practice of Rest

Throughout scripture, God invites us into the holy rhythm of Sabbath – a time to rest, renew, delight, and trust that God's work continues even when we pause. As a community of faith, we honor this gift by supporting our rostered staff in observing regular Sabbath days.

Our pastors' weekly Sabbath days are:

- Pastor Crowell – Tuesday
- Pastor Parham – Friday
- Pastor Preacher – Tuesday

On these days, our pastors step away from regular ministry responsibilities so they can rest, pray, spend time with loved ones, and be renewed for this ministry we share. If a pastoral emergency arises, please reach out to one of Trinity's rostered leaders who is not on Sabbath that day.

CHILDREN, YOUTH, AND FAMILIES

Special Opportunity for Youth and their Parents

Following worship on Sunday, August 9, youth and their parents are invited to enjoy lunch together followed by programming for both groups.

Jerry Wesley, Trinity's Coordinator for Mental Health Wellness, will lead parents in a workshop that includes practical ways to better communicate with their teens. Parents will explore ways to lean into the one-word answers, eye rolls, and the silent stares. Together participants will find ways to gain a better understanding of the teen communication style, social media, and technology challenges as well as how to improve overall teen-parent relationships.

Angie McCormack will lead youth in a hands-on service project and in planning for God's Work, Our Hands, our congregation-wide day of service taking place on Sunday, September 13. This will be a great opportunity to serve together, share ideas, and prepare for this meaningful event.

Children's Ministry

Following worship on Sunday, August 30, children in kindergarten through fifth grade are invited to stay for lunch and a fun-filled Back-to-School Celebration. Together, children will enjoy activities that remind them of God's constant presence. Children will participate in a Pencil Prayer, discover how everyday school supplies can teach about faith, be paired with a Prayer Partner for the school year, and take part in a Mission Challenge as they prepare to be the hands and feet of Christ at school and in their community.

Pray and Play Area in the Gym
