Assembling back-to-school gifts for TLC's teachers and students

Dear Beloved Trinity Community,

I am learning that disappointment is an inevitable part of relationship. We disappoint one another. Parents disappoint children. Children disappoint parents. Friends disappoint friends. Partners disappoint one another. Teachers disappoint students, and students disappoint teachers. Leaders disappoint the people who trust them. Pastors disappoint the communities they are called to shepherd. And, we disappoint ourselves.

Sometimes we fail to show up in the way someone hoped we would. Sometimes our words land differently than we intended. Sometimes we make a poor choice, miss an opportunity, forget something important, spill an entire cup of coffee on an important contract (I recently did that!), or simply discover that we cannot be everything someone needs or expects us to be. Disappointment is one of the unavoidable costs of being in relationship.

The good news is that, through grace, disappointment is not the end of the story. Jesus repeatedly gathered people around himself who misunderstood, failed, doubted, argued, and got it wrong. Peter denied Jesus. The disciples abandoned Jesus. Crowds who welcomed Jesus eventually turned away. And still, Jesus continued to call people into relationship. The gospel does not promise us relationships without disappointment. The gospel offers us something even better: the possibility of relationship after disappointment.

Grace is not pretending that we haven't hurt one another or disappointed one another. Grace tells the truth about what has happened while leaving room for the possibility that no single moment, mistake, or failure has the power to define the whole of a person.

May we be gentle with one another in times of disappointment. May we remember that our beloved community is not made up of perfect people. May God give us the grace to love each other even in times of disappointment.

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COUNCIL AND BUSINESS

Council Notes

At the August meeting of the Congregation Council, the council...

- received a new format for monthly reports from the pastoral staff that moves away from measuring ministry to efforts to make more meaning of ministry that includes a ministry story, challenge, and opportunity;
- learned from Pastor Preacher that Trinity has contracted with LiveControl to provide live-streaming services for all worship opportunities. One of the early learnings from this new way of managing the live-stream is that the numbers previously recorded for online attendance are elevated and new numbers will be accurate;
- received a Treasurer's Report from Mike Boliek noting that expenses for July were \$10,923 above projections due to unexpected expenses;
- learned from the Executive Committee that a partnership with The Nest, a progressive educational co-op led by Cindy Davis, has been approved;
- learned that the Church Office will continue recent schedule to be closed on Mondays and open from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm Tuesday through Friday;
- approved a motion from the Executive Committee to call a meeting of the Congregation for Sunday, September 13 at 11:30 am to act on a single motion with two parts that:
 - the sale of the 429 Property and parking area for a sale price of at least \$3,000,000, to include the redevelopment of both parking lots as presented at buyer's sole expense, and
 - use of the proceeds of the 429 Property sale, as presented;
- learned that efforts are being made to adjust the organizational structure in ways that focus on cooperation and collaboration and move away from a hierarchical structure;
- engaged in a meaningful and lengthy discussion about the disconnect between Trinity's mission and ministry and that of GOAL which led to the approval of a motion to remove all church support to GOAL, effective immediately, based on the changes in GOAL's missional focus; and
- learned that Frank Griffin has accepted a part-time position on the Church Staff serving as Coordinator for Finance and Sustaining Ministry.
