Dear Beloved Trinity Community,

I have been carrying this quote attributed to Rumi with me lately. I love the simplicity of it. It reminds me that faith is not ultimately about having all the answers or getting everything right. Faith is about being present to one another along the way.

In the miniseries Ripple (a recent favorite of mine), there is a beautiful reflection about what church can be. The pastor in this episode says: It's about the love and joy we find in each other. Faith...this community...means lifting each other up. That's what it is all about. Not rituals, not traditions, not tenets of the faith. Just simply lifting each other up.

These words describe what I believe deeply about our life together at Trinity. It's less about confessing certain tenets of the faith, agreeing to all the finer points of Lutheranism, or following a predetermined set of beliefs. Our life together is defined by how we love each other, how we love the guest among us, how we love our neighbors who, at times, seem so different from us. Our faith is best expressed when we notice someone who is hurting, celebrate someone who is flourishing, make room for someone who feels alone, and remind one another that no one has to walk this road by themselves.

We are on the journey together. And it is rarely easy. There are always obstacles, challenges, and burdens. Every day, we carry both grief and gratitude. We grieve what has been lost, what has changed, what we cannot fix, and the people who are no longer with us. And, at the very same time, we give thanks for the people who remain, for the new ones who are yet to find their way to us, for unexpected moments of grace, for laughter around a table, for music, for friendship, for the courage to begin again. This is what it means to be the beloved community: We hold each other through it all.

We don't walk alone. We walk together. And along the way, we keep lifting one another up – until, someday, in God's good time, we arrive safely home. I give thanks for the gift of walking this journey with each of you.
